However, Islamic finance related studies have been bourgeoning and also have found their way into top-ranking international journals. Similarly, the social concern of financial firms as a subject is academic and practical. As a result, we have observed the emergence of a large number of research in conventional and Islamic finance related areas. I am therefore confident that this research fits well with global research. I am not familiar with the mentioned framework and regulations; however, considering the importance attached to Islamic financial development in Muslim countries and also gaining prominence in the social dimension of finance in general, I am pleased to state that this thesis should be considered as part of the emerging field of global Islamic finance studies.

			Compared to the existing Islamic finance literature, a particular and novel methodology of identifying the social impact is provided, for which the author should be commended. Most of the literature uses the usual CSR framework, while the candidate in this study uses a different approach by employing different social hierarchical levels to assess the social function of Islamic banks. Hence, methodological contribution and distinct approach should be appreciated. Bringing digital platforms such as crowdfunding as part of the Islamic finance base deco-system should be considered a contribution to the literature. Mapping and developing Kazakhstan's ecosystem for Islamic social finance and crowdfunding system should be regarded as a contribution. Being a case study on Kazakhstan is also a successful attempt.

In particular, drawing conclusions and policy recommendations from the research for Kazakhistan should also be considered a successful articulation of the aims and objectives. Thus, the aims and objectives target to achieve theoretical contribution, methodological contribution, empirical contribution and generating an ecosystem and policies for the successful implementation of Islamic social finance through its social impact. Consequently, consistency is successfully achieved between the aims and objectives, contents, theoretical and empirical articulations, and policy and practical recommendations.

Theoretical frame, methodological frame, empirical conduct and case are all well connected to develop coherent research around the central argument and theme for which the candidate should be commended.
